Couches Don't Count as as a "Home," and if you are sleeping on one you still have the right to go to school, even without:

- paperwork
- proof of residency
- a notarized form transferring "educational guardianship" to an adult
- a parent to enroll you

Even if you ran away from home, you still are allowed to go to school.

No one should miss school because of where they sleep at night.

The McKinney-Vento federal law protects children and youth who are separated from their parents and legal guardians "for any reason" and requires IMMEDIATE SCHOOL ENROLLMENT in a school where they sleep at night, and gives students the right to REMAIN IN THEIR SCHOOL OF ORIGIN

REMAIN IN THEIR SCHOOL OF ORIGIN (where they last attended classes).
